SURPLUS EQUIPMENT: O'Connor said that he needs the cable machine in the workout room declared surplus so it can be removed. He said that no one uses it, that it is old, and that it takes up half of the room.

- i) Bob would like to attend the EMT class beginning in January 2021. Bob has signed the EMT Course Agreement with the Fire District and would like the Lagrange Fire District for the cost of the cost \$700.00 plus the cost of the textbooks. Provided Bob successfully completes the EMT course we are able to voucher NYS to reimburse the Fire District for the cost of the course (\$700.00). If he does not successfully complete the course it is his responsibility to reimburse the Fire District.
- ii) Bob is an active member at Company 3. Bob joined on 3.12.19. A review of his Firehouse Software record shows that he has attended a number of Fire classes as well as his OSHA Safety and HAZMAT classes. He recently attended his Bloodborne Pathogens class. Since January 1 2020 he has documented 18 Emergency Responses.

NYS EMT-Basic Original Training Agreement

This Agreement, made on OCTOBER 13, 2020 between the LaGrange Fire District, a political subdivision of New York State, with offices at 504 Freedom Plains Road, Town of LaGrange, Dutchess County, New York, hereinafter the District, and ROBERT PARRINELLO volunteer, presently residing at 3 MARTIN DRIVE, POULHKEEPSIE, Dutchess County, New York, hereinafter volunteer.

WHEREAS, It is the intention of the District to support volunteers of the District who have committed to furthering their education through attending an New York State Emergency Medical Technician – Basic program in order to obtain EMT-Basic Original certification and thereby better serve the District;

WHEREAS, Volunteer and District agree that to facilitate such EMT-Basic Original training it is in their mutual interests: and

WHEREAS, Volunteer acknowledges that the District will expend the sum of \$ 700.00 for tuition costs and the cost of current required textbooks to obtain EMT-Basic Original certification and it is anticipated that the volunteer will obtain New York State EMT-Basic Original Certification by **(DATE OF ANTICIPATED CERTIFICATION)**

NOW THEREFORE, It is agreed between District and Volunteer as follows:

- A) District shall advance to Dutchess Community College the sum of \$ 700.00 for tuition fees to obtain NYS EMT-Basic Original Certification, as well as the costs associated with the current required textbooks as provided by the District.
- B) Volunteer agrees to repay all such amounts advanced by the District plus interest at the rate of 5% per annum on the unpaid principal as follows:
 - a) On the first day of the month following thirty (30) days written notice to Volunteer, and on the first day of each month thereafter until all principal and accrued interest has been paid, Volunteer promises to pay to District the principal sum of \$125.00 plus accrued and unpaid interest.
 - b) Volunteer shall have the right to pay the entire amount due at any time without penalty.
- C) The District agrees to waive and forgive all amounts advanced as principal and accrued interest thereon only if:
 - a) Volunteer remains a member of the District for no less than 60 days following certification.
 - b) Volunteer completes all course requirements which results in successful NYS EMT-Basic Original Certification; and
 - c) Volunteer provides a copy of NYS EMT-Basic Original Certification to the District within five (5) business days of receiving said certification.

D) The District will enter into such an Agreement on one occasion. Should the volunteer fail to obtain successful NYS EMT-Basic Original Certification and desires to obtain such certification it shall be done at their own expense.

RESOLUTION TO OVERRIDE TAX LEVY LIMIT FOR 2021 ONLY

LaGrange Fire District
in the Town of LaGrange
Dutchess County, New York

WHEREAS, the Board of Fire Commissioners of the LaGrange Fire District in the Town of LaGrange, Dutchess County, New York (the "District") has budgetary increases that are beyond its control, for fiscal year 2021;

WHEREAS, the General Municipal Law 3-c generally requires that the District not increase its tax levy by more than the allowable levy growth factor above the prior year's budget tax levy and any available carryover; and

WHEREAS, the budgetary increases will require a tax levy increase, for the coming fiscal year 2021 only, beyond the allowable tax levy limit for 2021;

WHEREAS, the General Municipal Law 3-c(5) permits the District's Board of Fire Commissioners to exceed the properly calculated tax levy limit, for the coming fiscal year of 2021 only, upon a resolution of the Board, passed by a vote of sixty (60) percent of the total voting power of the Board of Fire Commissioners;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Fire Commissioners of the LaGrange Fire District hereby resolves, by a vote of at least sixty (60) percent of the total voting power of the Board of Fire Commissioners, as follows:

SECTION 1. The Board resolves to override the tax levy limit, for the coming fiscal year 2021 only;

SECTION 2. The Board shall be authorized to adopt a final 2021 budget that requires a tax levy that is greater than the tax levy limit as calculated for the coming fiscal year of 2021.
