At 6:01 pm, Chairman Marc Komorsky called the Board of Fire Commissioners' meeting to order for Tuesday, October 26th, 2021, and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

NOTABLE INCIDENTS: Fire Chief Tim O'Connor gave the Board a list of notable incidents that happened in the past couple of weeks (attached).

TRAINING: O'Connor said that he has a schedule for FLIPS (First Line Supervisor School) in NYC and that Lt. Plambeck has been notified he will be going beginning in January as he was on a waiting list.

PERSONNEL: Chief O'Connor said that there have been no changes.

GRANTS: The Chief noted that the District has a November 11th deadline to say yes or no to the grant.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Chief O'Connor said that he had one personnel items for Executive Session.

- **EMS Administrator –**

PREHOSPITAL MEDICATION: EMS Administrator Benenati informed the Board that he has been working the past two weeks on the supply for prehospital medications because, due to some regulation reinterpretations, the District can no longer get them from the hospitals. He said he is working with Arlington Fire District to reach out to several vendors to get a reasonable source for the medications. He said he doesn't have an estimated cost yet but noted it would not be cheap. Short discussion followed regarding assistance from the state.

PURCHASING: Benenati requested authorization to purchase 2 baby CPR mannikins through Laerdal Corporation for \$3508.77. Short discussion followed regarding whether there was money in the budget for the mannikins.

Benenati reported that he will be taking the 2018 47-71 to Berlin, NJ, on Thursday to get a walkthrough of the body work and some warrantied repairs to get an estimate for work needed. He then gave the Board an update on his meeting in Albany with the state's Emergency Medical Services Council about the challenges being faced across the state – from staffing, mutual aid, sustainability, cost, time, lack of back up, lack of leadership, etc. – and said it went exceptionally well but there is still a lot of work to be done.

Further discussion followed on the purchase of the mannikins and end of the year budget transfers.

Upon a MOTION made by Burns and SECONDED by Piehler, the Board RESOLVED to approve the two baby mannikins for CPR purposes for \$3508.77. Burns – Aye, Piehler – Aye, Sassi – Aye, Pignataro – Aye, Komorsky – Aye. **Motion Carried.**

- **Repairs and Repair Requests** – Chief O'Connor reported that an emergency plumbing repair was done at Station 1 due to a leak in the women's bathroom. He said that Redemption Mechanical had also given a price to fix the oil/water separator at Station 3 so he told them to go ahead and make the repair because no water can be used on the floor at Station 3 until it is fixed.
- **Recruitment & Retention** – Secretary Le said there is one applicant that recently met with the membership committee and has been instructed to schedule a physical as the next step in the application process. Chief O'Connor reported that the recently appointed member, Art Holzmann, has started some of the in house training needed.

RESOLUTION TO OVERRIDE REAL PROPERTY TAX CAP FOR 2022 ONLY

LaGrange Fire District
in the Town of LaGrange
Dutchess County, New York

WHEREAS, the Board of Fire Commissioners of the LaGrange Fire District (The Board) must adopt a proposed budget for 2022 which includes an estimate of fund balances in preparation for the annual fire district budget hearing and

WHEREAS, the board did adopt its proposed budget in preparation for the budget hearing, and

WHEREAS, the LaGrange Fire District held its annual fire district budget hearing on notice to the public on October 19th, 2021, wherein the Board considered the proposed budget and comments received for and against the proposed budget at said budget hearing, and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that the fire district for 2022 needs to exceed the real property tax cap established pursuant to General Municipal Law §3-c for that budget year due to financial considerations discussed by the board at its meeting in preparation of the budget, and

WHEREAS, the proposed budget for 2022 calls for a real property tax levy that will exceed the real property tax cap which allows a tax levy of no more than \$8,279,279; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to General Municipal Law §3-c, the fire district may adopt a budget that requires a tax levy that is greater than the tax levy limit for the coming fiscal year only if the board of fire commissioners first enacts a resolution, approved by a vote of sixty percent of the total voting power of such body, to override such limit for such coming fiscal year only.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Fire Commissioners approves this resolution to override the real property tax cap for the 2022 budget only, in order to permit an annual real property tax levy that will exceed the real property tax cap which permits only a 2.97% increase in said tax levy which will result in a final annual fire district budget in the amount of \$8,276,279 and

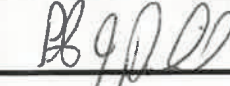
