- **Out of County Training Requests** – Chief O'Connor said he received an email earlier in the afternoon about a Fire Officer I in Putnum County that starts May 30th and still has seats available.

O'Connor reported that they sent people to Westchester the past two Friday and he hears that there are more requests coming up.

- DC Board of Elections Poll Site Notice Le said they received notice from the Dutchess County Board of Elections that they plan on using Station 2 for a poll site for the primary election on June 27th. She said there was a BoFC meeting scheduled that night and asked if the Board wanted to move locations or reschedule the meeting. Brief discussion followed regarding when to hold the meeting. Komorsky said they would hold it Monday, June 26th at 6 pm.
- **FPAT Request for Assistance** Chief O'Connor said that Fairview (FD) needs to put three people through an FPAT on June 10th and has asked the District for help. He noted that Fairview helped LaGrange on a recent FPAT. He said they have asked for three people to assist.

Upon a MOTION made by Ward and SECONDED by Pignataro, the Board RESOLVED to approve. Burns – Aye, Pignataro – Aye, Sassi – Aye, Ward – Aye, Komorsky – Aye. **Motion Carried**.

- LaGrange Soccer Club Request for EMS Standby – O'Connor said that the LaGrange Soccer Club has requested the District to provide EMS standby coverage for their tournament on September 2nd & 3rd. He said there would be approximately 750 players plus spectators over the two days.

- **Boar's Head Event** – DC Champion said he received a request for the District's participation in a PR event sponsored by Boar's Head. He described the event and said it would be at Shop Rite in LaGrange and they would like an engine and a couple of personnel in their gear. Pignataro said he would pass on the event. Champion said he would let Boar's Head know that the District was unable to commit at this time.

EMS Administrator Michael Benenati stated that it is appropriate to recognize the EMS providers during EMS Week and in addition to the proclamation he stated that they appreciate the effort of the staff on a daily basis.
