At 6:00 pm, Chairman Marc Komorsky called the Board of Fire Commissioners Regular Meeting to order for Tuesday, June 11th, 2024, and led the Pledge of Allegiance. He welcomed everyone to the meeting.

MINUTES: - 5/28/24 Regular Meeting

Upon a MOTION made by Commissioner Pignataro and SECONDED by Commissioner Ward, the Board RESOLVED to approve the 5/28/24 Regular Meeting minutes with a correction to change “they do not go to standbys” to “they do not bill for standbys” under Staffing Community Events. Sassi – Aye, Ward -Aye, Taft – Abstain, Pignataro – Aye, Komorsky - Aye. **Motion Carried.**

CORRESPONDENCE:

- Check from Sobo & Sobo Law for subpoenaed records was received in the amount of \$8.25.
- Check from TEG Federal Credit Union for CPR training course was received in the amount of \$425.00.

Upon a MOTION made by Commissioner Pignataro and SECONDED by Commissioner Sassi, the Board RESOLVED to deposit the both the Sobo & Sobo Law check in the amount of \$8.15 and the TEG Federal Credit Union check in the amount of \$425.00 into the General Fund. Sassi – Aye, Ward -Aye, Taft – Aye, Pignataro – Aye, Komorsky - Aye. **Motion Carried.**

OLD BUSINESS/UNRESOLVED ITEMS:

- Station 1 Building Update – Commissioner Ward stated there was no update at this time. They are looking at the September timeframe for the comprehensive spec for the entire project for Station 1.
- Station 3 Storage Room – Commissioner Ward stated there is no update at this time.
- Station 2 Brick Pointing – Commissioner Ward stated there is no update at this time.
- Physicals status update – Commissioner Sassi stated he met with the Chief during the week. They went over the current practice. It looks like they are going to stay with both The Workplace and TEK Occupational. They will continue to review to make sure each provider is in line with what is needed for each class of firefighter. Chairman Komorsky asked if anyone was going to TEK and

Commissioner Sassi stated that volunteers are. Chairman Komorsky asked if there were any issues there and both Commissioner Sassi and Chief Champion said there are no issues. Chief Champion stated he went there before the volunteers had started to, so it has been a work in progress.

- Staffing Community Events – Commissioner Sassi stated his piece of this was to see if they were going to pay overtime or use current staffing going forward. He could probably be dropped from this part of the conversation moving forward. His portion was really regarding the practice part of it. Chairman Komorsky asked what they were doing for staffing of the Knight’s Carnival. Chief Champion stated he went to all the June meetings except Station 2’s and asked for help from the volunteers for staffing the BLS staff car for football games. They will roster an ambulance for the football games. He did forget to mention the carnival, but will put it out with the same parameters in an email to the entire district. They will try to staff the carnival with an ambulance that is already here in service. Chairman Komorsky stated that would not pay overtime because they will stay there until there is another call, and then they will respond. The Chief stated the carnival is different. If they find after the first or second night that the ambulance is overwhelmed and unable to get out, it may benefit them to have a third ambulance in service. They will wait and see what the situation dictates. Commissioner Pignataro stated that was a great way to handle it. Chairman Komorsky stated this was the perfect opportunity for some of the volunteers to get out in the community.
- ESO Reporting status update – Chief Champion stated there in no new information on this.
- Grant update – Chief Champion stated he is working Secretary Le getting some information to close out the COVID grants. He signed the agreement with Dutchess County on the MIG Grant and is waiting to hear back as to what the next step is. He just submitted another reimbursement request for the SAFER Grant. He needs to get with Secretary Le and Treasurer Pozniak to get accurate numbers to start the 2024 reimbursements. Commissioner Pignataro asked how much time is left for the reimbursements. The Chief stated he believed it was a three year period for the reimbursements. Secretary Le stated they didn’t start submitting right away because it took some time to hire. Then they were told they could add that time to catch up. Commissioner Ward stated they would see the detail in the budget for next year.
- Station 2 Meeting Room Videoconferencing System – Chief Champion stated that is a work in progress. He believes they are waiting on one additional component to arrive.
- Diesel Tank Accessories - Chief Champion said he was talking with Scott Price and they were seeing if it was more financially feasible to install jersey barriers instead of bollards. Chairman Komorsky stated jersey barriers move unless you install the steel rods. Commissioner Ward stated they need to find out what the code requires. Chairman Komorsky suggested calling Ken from the Building Department.
- HIPAA Compliance –Chief Champion stated that he met with Commissioner Sassi this week. They are on the same page for the document that is being reviewed and will come back to the Board at a future date. Chairman Komorsky and Commissioner Pignataro thanked both men for their work on this.

- Building Repairs/Repair Requests – Chairman Komorsky asked if anybody had anything that they had not already spoken about. There was none.

NEW BUSINESS: -

- Strategic Safety Dynamics quote for high-pressure air bags – Chairman Komorsky stated everyone had a copy of this in the packet. Commissioner Pignataro asked what this was for. Chief Champion stated this is for replacing the high pressure airbags that they use in a rescue scenario. The current airbags that they have on their rescue have expired so they need to get new ones. Through their research Lieutenants Zittel and Rancourt announced that the proposed ones are the most suitable for the District's uses now and moving forward. This provider is the only one on the Eastern seaboard and it does go in line with future purchases that they are looking to do. In the tech realm they have moved to Paratech material. It is very versatile and used on auto accidents and a multitude of technical operations. Commissioner Pignataro asked if all the surrounding areas use this type as well. Chief Champion stated Arlington and Union Vale both use it that he knows of. Chairman Komorsky asked if they could sell the old, expired airbags to another country. Chief Champion stated he would have to look into that as he does not have a full understanding as they are rated for a certain time and usage. They have never been blown up in excess of what has been recommended but he can look into it. Commissioner Ward stated they would be a liability to just give them away. Chairman Komorsky was just curious if there was any other use for them. He asked how they go about approving this as it is above the Chief's purchasing limit and this is the only supplier on the East Coast. Commissioner Ward stated they had a budget item for Paratech airbags multi force double stack high-lift and they also have an airbag kit for three bags, model 48 Paratech. He asked what this was compared to what they have in the equipment budget. Chief Champion stated it should be the same thing. Commissioner Ward stated they originally had \$19,000 in the budget and the estimate is for \$14,908.00. Commissioner Sassi pointed out a contract number on the bid meaning that they are on state bid. Chairman Komorsky asked how long the new ones would be good for before they expire. Chief Champion stated he would look into it but he believes it is approximately 10 years.

Upon a MOTION made by Commissioner Pignataro and SECONDED by Commissioner Ward, the Board RESOLVED to accept the Strategic Safety Dynamics estimate for the multi force remote airbag and all of the related items that go with it as per the quote in the amount of \$14,908.85. Sassi – Aye, Ward – Aye, Pignataro – Aye, Taft – Aye, Komorsky - Aye. **Motion Carried.**

Chairman Komorsky asked if anyone had any additional new business. There was none.

REPORTS: (by officers present)

- **Treasurer Pozniak** - no report in his absence.
- **Chief Anthony Champion** -Chief Champion stated he uploaded a quote provided for a Coldwater/Swift Water purchase to the Teams file. There was a purchase through a grant of two boats and two motors. It is between LaGrange and Arlington. Arlington's boat is definitely dry rotted and Lagrange's boat is starting to dry rot and they are down to one motor. They cannot get any repair parts for that motor. The price provided is the cost of two boats, hard decking, and motors, two of each quantity. This would be a replacement. Chairman Komorsky

stated this would strictly be for LaGrange's use. Chief Champion stated Arlington did the legwork in getting the quote and Chief Champion spoke with Chief Steenburg and they both agreed that they would each cover the boat and motor for themselves in the spirit of continuing their cooperative relationship. With this type of purchase the equipment is the same for both districts so the ability to operate either one is the same. Chairman Komorsky asked why should they purchase it like this instead of each district purchasing separately. Chief Champion stated both departments would be purchasing their own boat and motor. They would just be the same style for commonality and ease-of-use between the two districts. Commissioner Ward stated there is nothing shared beyond them being the same. Commissioner Ward stated that the original funding was through the State and the rationale for that funding was so they could get deployed anywhere in the State as a team. With common equipment it is easier on the users. Chief Champion stated the quote for this \$24,560 and LaGrange would be responsible for \$12,280. Commissioner Ward stated their original price for replacement was \$15,000 so this is a savings as well. Chairman Komorsky asked if they were going to use the same trailer and Chief Champion said yes. It is a 12-foot zodiac like what they have. Commissioner Pignataro asked what they would do with the old boat. Chief Champion stated it could still be used for training for a little while. Commissioner Ward stated in the old one they had a metal floor. He asked if that was included in this, and Chief Champion said yes.

Upon a MOTION made by Commissioner Pignataro and SECONDED by Commissioner Sassi, the Board RESOLVED to purchase a boat and motor in the amount of \$12,280. Sassi– Aye, Ward – Aye, Pignataro – Aye, Taft – Aye, Komorsky - Aye. **Motion Carried.**

There is an electric bus drill that Matthews Buses Inc. is hosting in conjunction with Arlington School District. It is tonight and tomorrow night. All on-duty staff was there tonight and they will be there tomorrow barring any emergencies. There will be an additional 12 people going to tomorrow night's that will be a mix between volunteer and career. There is a Battery Emergency Electrical Storage Systems Class being held on the 18th at Dutchess County Department of Emergency Response at 7 PM. Next week there is some off-site training at Pleasant Valley fire station. They have a house they have for training, and they have been kind enough to share that facility with LaGrange. It will be on the 19th and the 21st. Chairman Komorsky stated there are more Teslas and battery-operated vehicles on the road than ever before. He asked if all staff members were familiar with procedures if there is an emergency with those ion lithium batteries. Chief Champion stated yes, they know to smother them with water. Lots and lots of water. He stated Seth Pearson was kind enough to get information on all the models of Tesla laminated and put up in the rigs. The Chief has reached out to look into the EV blanket. It is something to go over the batteries and keep them cool after the fire has initially been extinguished. All of the career staff have an app on their phone for EV vehicles and to enter the VIN number and it tells exactly where cutoffs are, cutting spots, and other necessary information.

Central Hudson is moving forward with the Community Gas Drill on the 28th. The duty staff will be in attendance. There will be an MCI EMS component where they will be evacuating individuals as well as an additional aspect. Commissioner Pignataro asked where it was going to be held and Chief Champion stated at the high school. There will be a communication out to the Arlington School District families and surrounding businesses letting them know that there

will be a drill in progress. The Chief will be out of town from the 22nd through the 30th of this month. He is looking to see who will fill his position for this drill. He will inform the board when he knows. Chairman Komorsky stated in last few years there have been gas lines installed in various roads in locations around town. He asked if the Chief had been provided with a map of all of those gas lines. The Chief stated he has a rough idea of where they are but he is not sure if he has a map. Chairman Komorsky suggested getting a map. The Chief stated Central Hudson is also very good about putting out their yellow flags.

Chief Champion stated the Board was gracious enough to make an emergency purchase of a compressor. It is in this house in the back of the bays. It is a very nice piece of equipment that will serve them well in the future. With that installation, it has created some potential future space issues. He is enlisting help to come up with the spatial issues as the future purchase of a rescue could be longer than the current rescue that is in that space. There are a few architects in the area who work on fire stations he will reach out to. Chairman Komorsky asked how much larger the next rescue could potentially be and Chief Champion stated it could be anywhere from 18 inches to 2 feet longer. He stated there are things that they can move around with relative ease for this to stay where it is. Commissioner Ward stated they could make the spec required to have the truck the same size as what is currently there. Chief Champion stated he has expressed that multiple times to the committee. Chairman Komorsky asked if a tanker could fit in where the rescue is now. Chief Champion stated that is very possible. Chairman Komorsky stated there has been discussion regarding the space behind where the Board is sitting and that a larger vehicle could go in there. It could be a drive-through space for it. Chief Champion stated that is a possibility. He is just trying to look to the future to see what can work in the confines they have or what additional space that may be needed. He knows there is a list of improvements that he has gone over with Commissioner Ward. Commissioner Ward stated that his opinion is that right now the assumption should be that the vehicle has got to fit in the space it is allocated. There is no financial planning in an area that already has financial deficits. Chief Champion stated he is was presenting the seeds now, so they can look towards building up that fund for the future. Commissioner Ward stated they will not be able to do building modifications in the next two years. Chief Champion stated the build time for the truck will be four years. Chief Champion is requesting that it fit in the space that the current rescue has. They have changed from a tandem axle to a single axle. Chairman Komorsky stated that unless they can keep the space the way it is with just moving things around, he is amenable to hearing what that is about without any structural change to the building. Commissioner Ward stated he does not need the Board's input for that. They have to work on their deficits. Chief Champion stated he will continue to look at grants. Commissioner Ward stated that grants should be looked at as spending relief not as a plan for future spending. Commissioner Pignataro stated they support the Chief on trying to keep the truck sized for the existing space. Commissioner Ward stated they are looking at \$1.3 million for this rescue truck. With the planned replacement cycle they are upside down in 2030 almost \$350,000, even with the spending at 1.3 million. He stated that the committee needs to recognize that there is a dollar limit, and they should not assume that just because they are asking for it, it can be done. Chief Champion stated Rescue 1 was here last week with a demo truck and it looks very similar to the current rescue in length and stature. The process that the salesman stated was that they will give a projection of the cost, but they are not locked in until the chassis is signed on and in-line. Then they will give a projection for the rest of the build.

Commissioner Ward stated what he is suggesting is that once the committee gets the estimate they may need to go back and delete some items.

Chief Champion stated at the last meeting he referenced they needed to go to Calvary Chapel. Firefighter Henry went over there and Lieutenant Wern sent a firefighter for support and the church was very thankful that they went. In the kitchen is a poster that one of the children made for the firefighters.

Friday is Overlook Primary's Flag Day, and the fire department has been invited to participate. They will be there approximately 9:15 for a 9:30 event.

The other events that in the past have required their participation are the Fall Festival and the Festival of Lights. He feels that they need to be present for Community Day and Fall Festival as this is their own community. In the past they have committed an ambulance and an engine to that and would like to do that moving forward. Chairman Komorsky stated the community is very grateful for their attendance at this. He was there this past Saturday and there was lots of activity around the fire truck. The kids loved it.

The Chief is setting up a time to get the locks on the doors changed out for the key access. On the Teams app for tonight's meeting the Chief did upload the status provided by the mechanic. He noted anything that has had work on it since the last meeting and left blanks for anything that has not had anything done since then.

The Chief had a personal request from a volunteer member associated with the Knights of Columbus. He is requesting that they be able to post an advertisement for the Carnival at Station 3 on the small grass hill to the left of the bays. The request was made by Art Holzmann. Attorney Hekle asked if they typically allow for posting and Commissioner Ward said no. They try to avoid posting for any solicitous purpose. The attorney stated it gets to be a very slippery slope. Commissioner Ward was not in favor of this. Commissioner Pignataro agreed with him. Chief Champion will communicate that back to the member.

The Membership Committee is reaching out to the individual that has been absent for a while to see where he is and they will get back to the Board on his status. This is a member that was approved by the Board, but it is unclear what his current status with the company is.

Chief Champion is close to a final draft with the Medical Director position. They are working on the certifications and insurance to see what kind of insurance is currently provided for the Medical Director. This is for the liability portion of the insurance. The Chief is trying to see if the district covers workers' comp and general liability. Attorney Hekle stated they can create waivers but he needs to know what the terms are going to be. Commissioner Ward stated workers' comp is something that you offer to an employee. Attorney Hekle stated this is more of a vendor agreement. Commissioner Ward stated the only insurance they might consider would be some sort of indemnification so that they are protected. Attorney Hekle stated they should not be given insurance but some sort of stipend for what work they are providing. Commissioner Taft stated their current insurance may cover them. Commissioner Sassi stated if there are policies and procedures on the district level that may impact them there might need to be some kind of indemnification for them. They could also be making decisions at a higher level and that could give liability to the district. Attorney Hekle stated there could be a mutual indemnification clause scoping out those issues. Chief Champion stated he hopes to have something to present to the Board by the end of next week. Commissioner Sassi asked if they ever had a conversation about what the compensation package would look like. Chief Champion stated he had suggested a gas card or something along those lines, but the consensus was for a monetary agreement. The number agreed upon was \$5000. That is the

recommendation from the State. Commissioner Sassi asked how many other departments are hiring the same person and what that compensation would be. Chief Champion stated he does not know but he is working into this agreement for multiple medical directors so that will help. Chairman Komorsky asked who Arlington is using and Chief Champion did not recall the name of the person. He is trying to base his contract off of the State's recommendations. Commissioner Sassi stated he thought they were also going to try to incorporate into the agreement for this person to do some CME's. He asked if that was going to be part of the proposal as well and Chief Champion said yes. They will also be doing call audits and they will have to sign off on any CME certifications for the medics. There may be some request on their side as well as the paramedics are working under their license. Commissioner Sassi stated he would like to know what their return is on the \$5000. He wants to know if they are just overseeing the operations and signing off on the CME packets or would there be call audits and CME's. If they're doing 20 departments and spread thin, they might be getting their money's worth. Chief Champion stated there are parameters with medical directors. They cannot exceed a certain number of ALS and BLS agencies. He thinks down the line they may have to have two medical directors, which is a benefit because they get two different points of view. To start out with one right now is not overburdened. He does want the person to come in for CME's and call audits and help with the QA/QI process, if there is a disciplinary piece, or something that is questionable in the care that is provided. Commissioner Pignataro asked if the goal was to have the Medical Director information to the attorney by the 28th and Chief Champion said yes.

Chief Champion stated he has four personnel items for executive session.

- **Department** – Chairman Komorsky stated there was nothing to report.
- **Union** – There was nothing to report.
